1985 marks the 35th year of the IEEE Treasure Hunt in the Valley. The prizes awarded winners over the years have had little monetary value, yet the competition for first place has become keener each year. The excitement has grown, and the red hunting caps awarded Treasure Hunt winners have become the prized possession in many a trophy cabinet. Wearing this red crown of victory accords winners the privilege (and responsibility) of serving a three-year term on the Treasure Hunt Committee - trying to stump their cohorts.

Beginning in 1970 all two-time winners with six years of committee service, or one-time winners who have had less than three years of respite from committee service, have been offered the opportunity to declare their car "professional". This must be done upon application for tickets to the hunt.

In 1982 the 1970 resolution was amended to limit those teams who wish to declare themselves "professional" to those who have three or more members qualifying as exempt from committee service under the 1970 resolution.

Because of experience gained since 1970, in administering the 1970 "pro" resolution, the committee has made the following interpretation of the resolution. This is being done to define in detail how the resolution should be administered and to avoid confusing situations which have occurred or might occur.

A professional team agrees not to compete against amateur teams in the hunt. First, second, and third place prizes will be awarded to the three amateur teams with the lowest times per clue. If a professional team has the lowest time per clue for the hunt, the accomplishment will be announced, and the team members which qualify the team for "pro" status will be awarded "PRO" buttons to be affixed to their previously won red hats. In addition, this team will be admitted to the new "Pro-Button Winners" section of the Hall of Fame. Other pro teams which have times per clue lower than the third place winners will be announced for their respectable showing. Pro teams which ran near the end of the pack will also be announced in order to give encouragement to the novice first year teams which have participated.

Of course, eligible hunters who chose not to be declared "professional" for the hunt will compete and be eligible for first, second, or third place. Also, if this choice is made and the team helps bring up the rear, they will be left alone to hide at their dark corner table behind their beer pitchers where they need not fear the announcement of their boondoggle.

Through the years many couples who are not IEEE members have served on the committee. They have contributed significantly in making the Treasure Hunt the success that it has been over the past 35 years. Because of this, non-member couples who have served on the committee are given the same status as member couples when ticket preference is given. Of course, non-member ticket prices must still be paid by these couples.

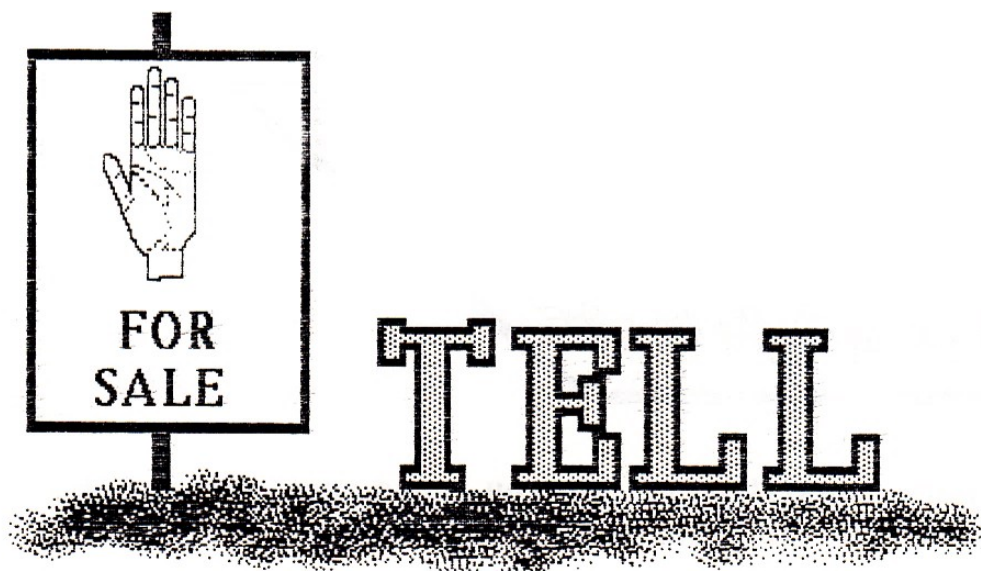

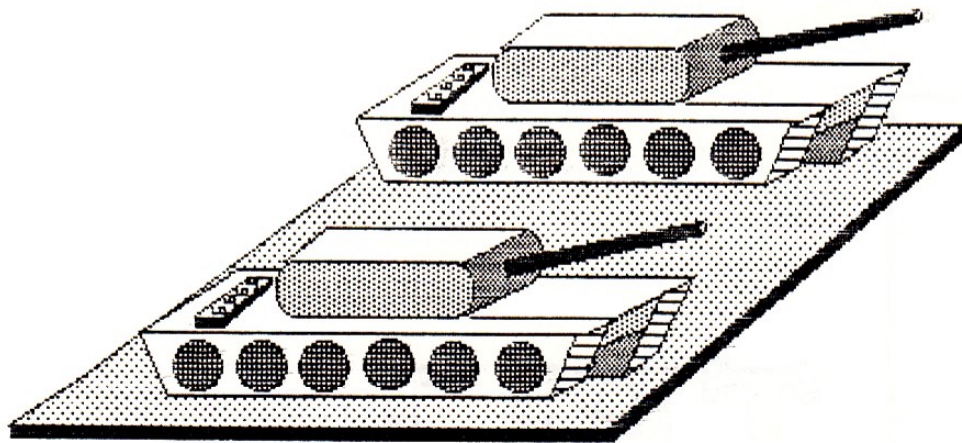

Circle 95 is located near the intersection of Rio Verde Drive and 128th Street. From this intersection, drive south on 128th Street for 1.5 miles. The cluesite is behind a tank, 40 feet east of the road.

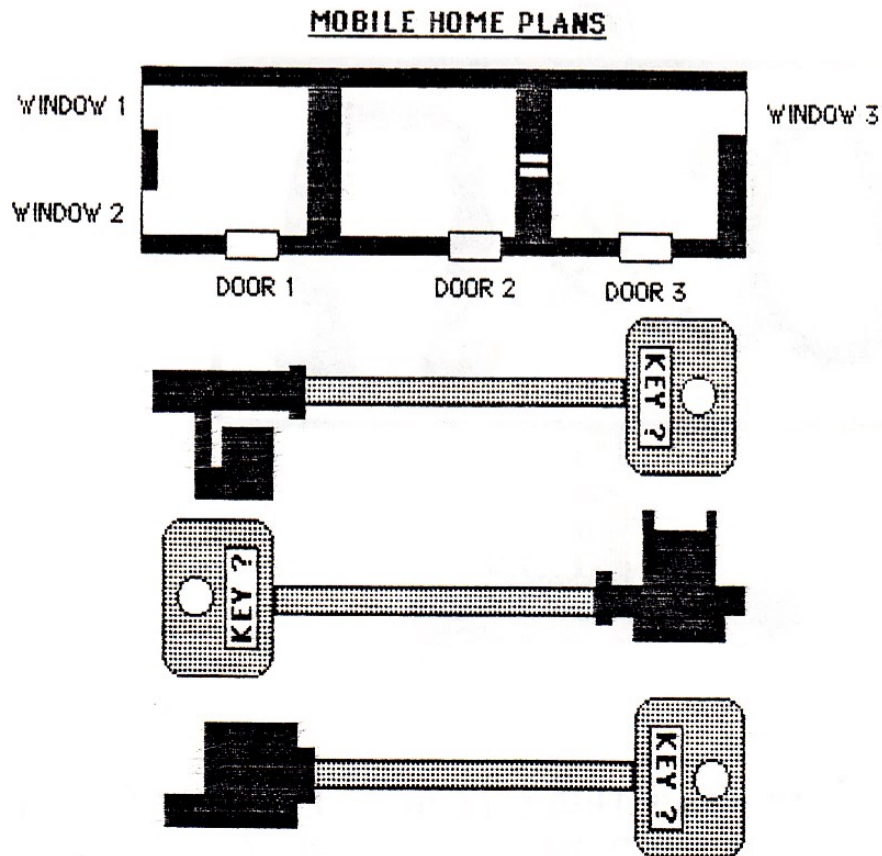

Circle 13 is located near the intersection of 136th Street and Rio Verde Drive. From this intersection, travel south on 136th St. for 0.3 miles. The cluesite is located 20 feet south of a fence, 180 feet east of the road, underneath a Palo Verde tree.

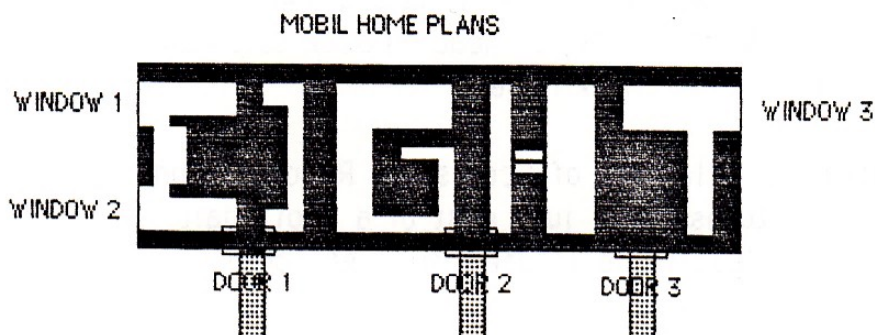

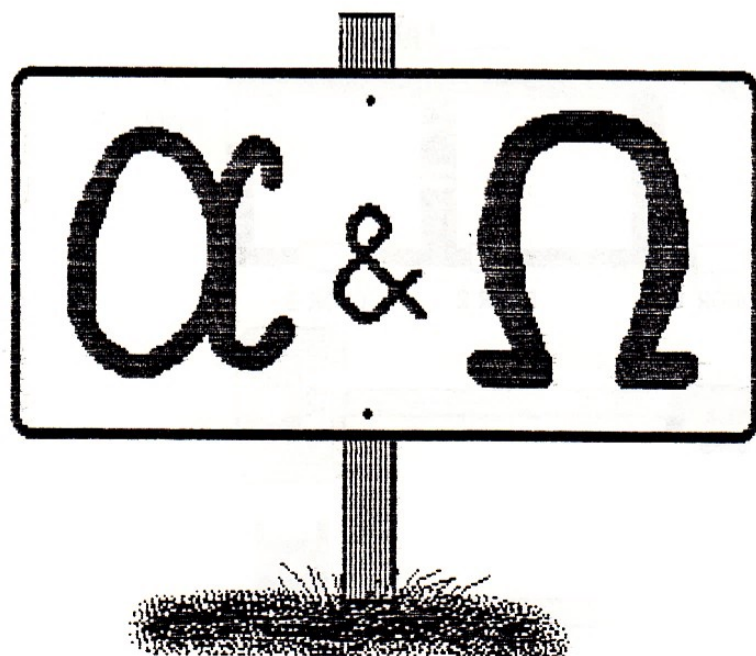

The "key" to this clue is cutting out the keys and putting them in the proper doors. The correct solution will direct you to Circle 8 as shown:



Circle 8 is located on a dirt road that turns north off of Rio Verde Drive 0.15 miles past Reata Pass restaurant. Travel 0.36 miles on this dirt road to where it forks to the right and joins a parallel road to the east. The cluesite is located 150 feet northwest near some rocks at the top of a small hill.

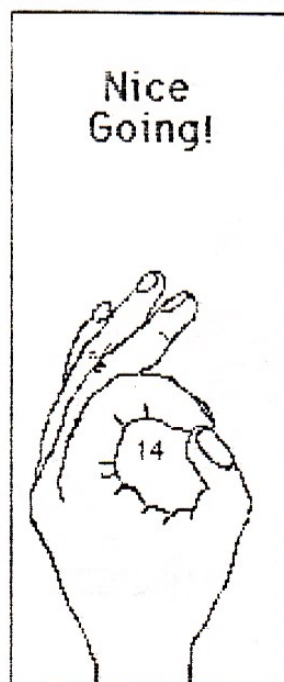
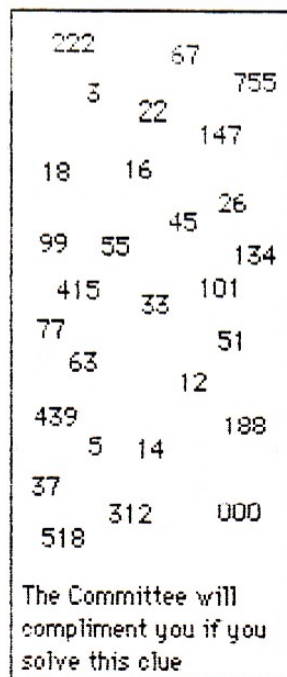

Surely you must have recognized this clue as alpha - ampersand- omega, or alpha and omega. Alpha is the begining of the Greek alphabet and omega is the ending--Ah Ha -- and where is the begining and end, of the Treasure Hunt, that is? Why Rawhide of course, so head on back to Circle 971 near Rawhide, even if it isn't time to check in yet.

Circle 971 is located 0.5 mile east of Scottsdale Road on Pinnacle Peak Road where 76th Street turns north just east of a Scottsdale Well (A44 11-38) enclosure. The cluesite is located 40 feet north of well wall behind a bush.

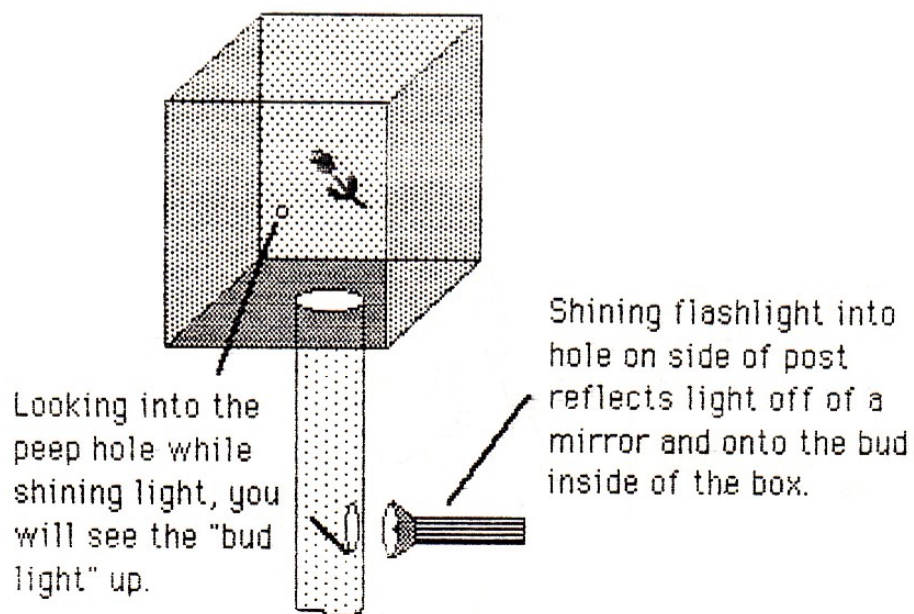

And did you notice that the rectangle of numbers was the same size as the card? If you aligned the card over the rectangle of numbers (shown on the right), the single number 14 would appear in the opening.....so OK, already, head for Circle 14.

Circle 14 is located near the intersection of Pinnacle Peak Road and Pima Road. From this intersection, travel 1.4 miles east to Church Rd. Turn south on Church Rd. for 0.6 miles to Foothills Dr. Travel 0.11 miles east on Foothills Dr. to a road that turns south. Drive 0.14 miles south to where the road ends in a circle. The cluesite is located 180 feet east of the center of the circle on the east side of a wash, under a Palo Verde tree.

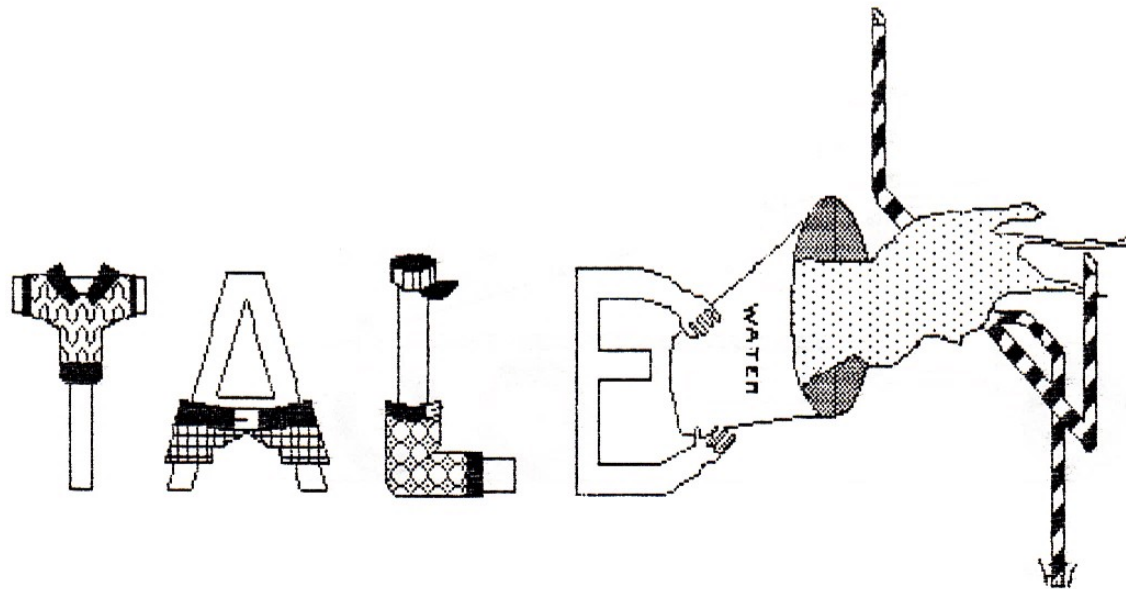

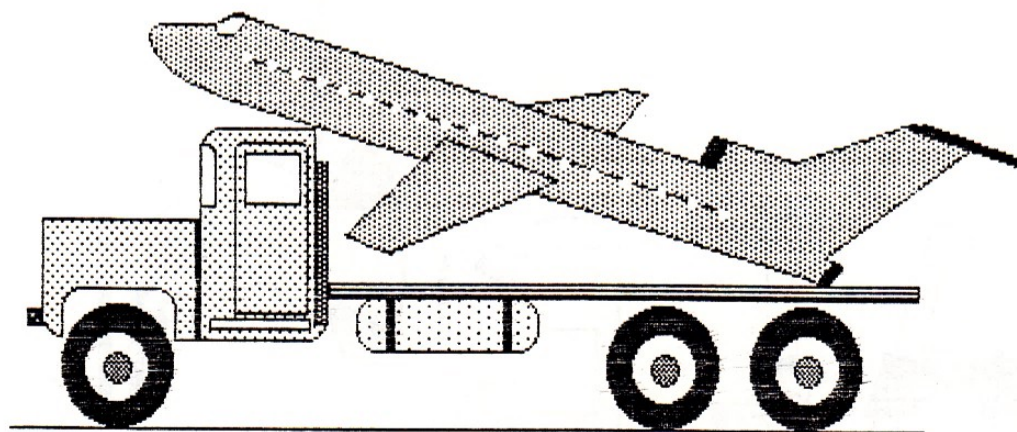

Circles Au and H₂O are located near the intersection of Pima Road and Raintree Drive. From this intersection, travel west on Raintree Dr. for 0.52 miles. At this point a dirt road turns south from Raintree. Travel on this road for 0.05 miles. The cluesite is located 60 feet west of this road under an ironwood tree on the bank of a wash.

Circle 1 is located 1.75 miles north of the intersection of Bell Road and Scottsdale Road. Turn right just south of the Scottsdale Well (A44 26-33) enclosure and travel east on a dirt trail for 0.15 miles. The cluesite is located 73 feet east of the trail at the base of a mesquite tree.

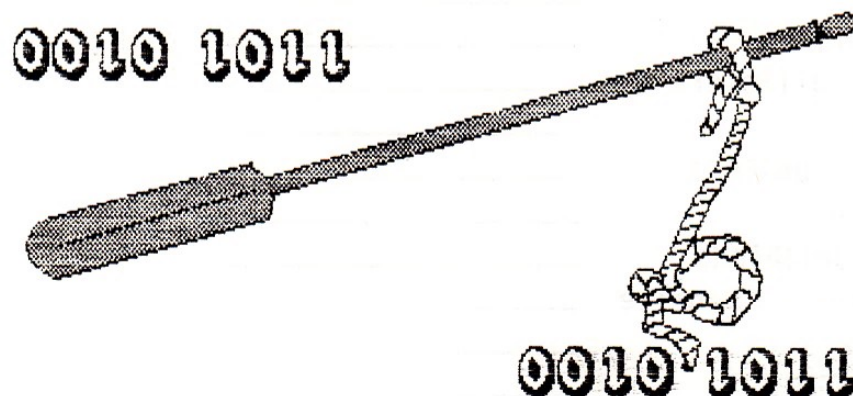

Circle 49 is located near the intersection of Tatum Blvd. and Union Hills Drive. From the intersection travel 0.05 miles west on a dirt road. The cluesite is located 100 feet north of the road at the base of a mesquite tree on the south side of the CAP canal bank.

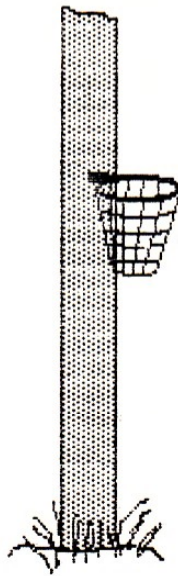

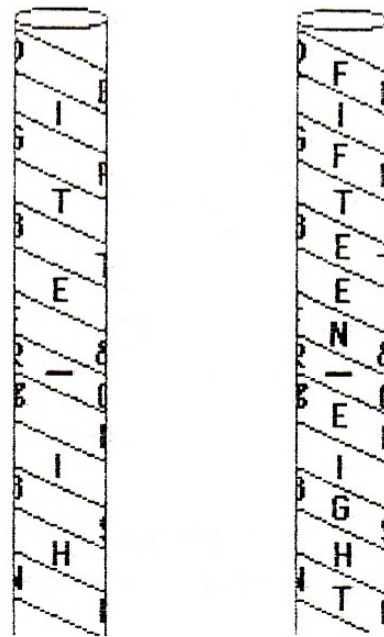

In the Brown Bag is a Sun Devil Basketball promotional sticker stating, **"Sun Devils do it over the rim!"** We hoped you would take your best shot and slam dunk that other team that you just know has followed you from clue to clue. 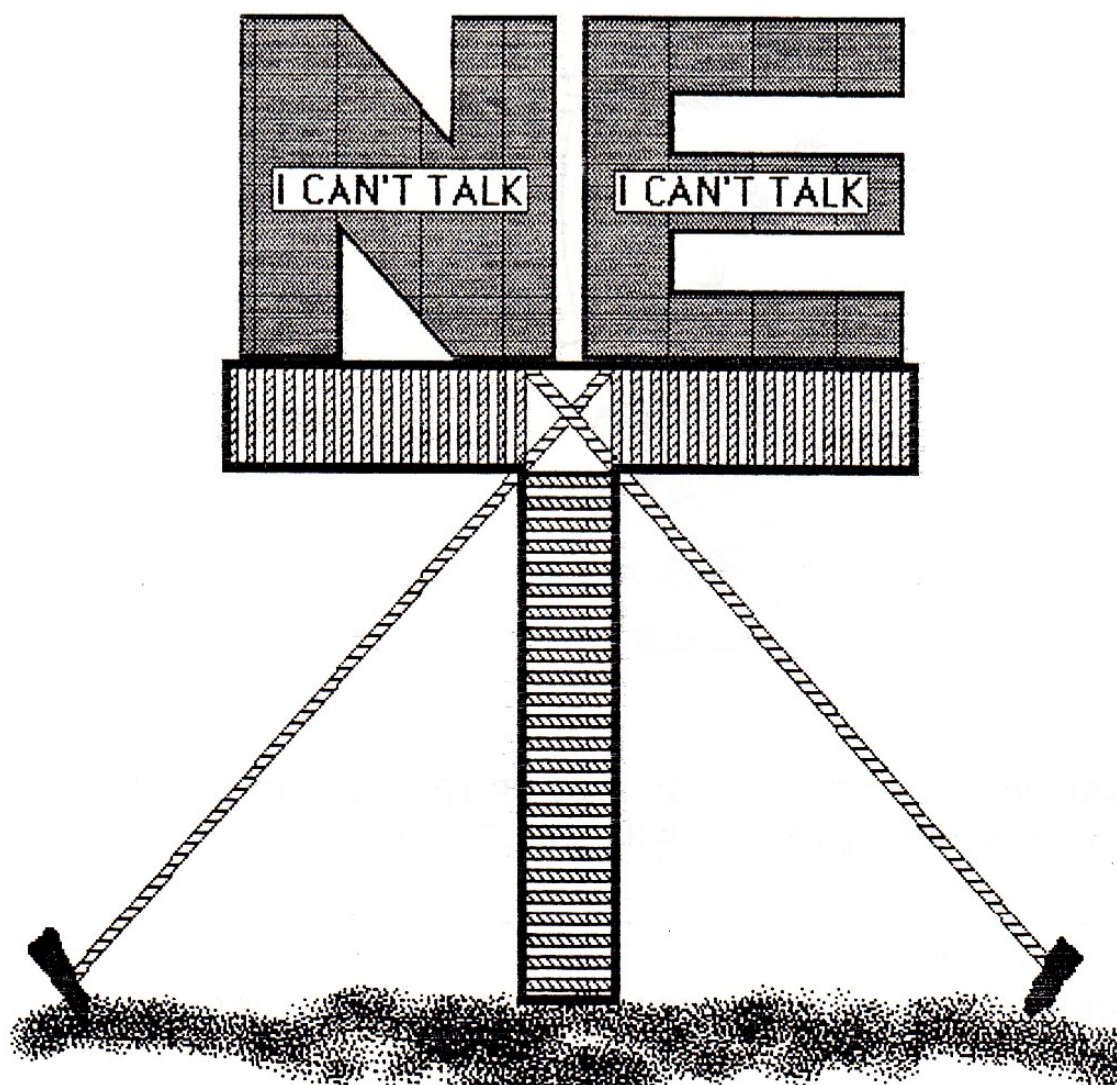

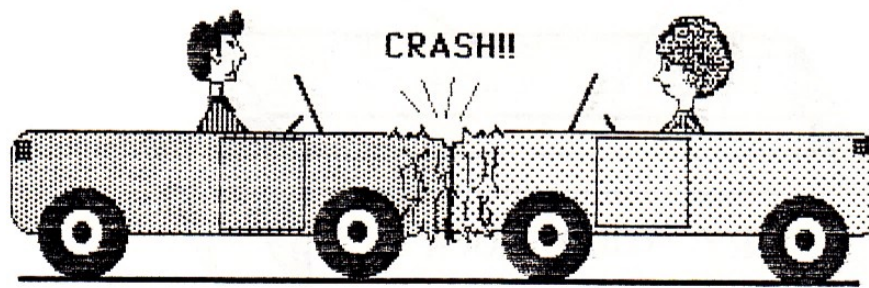
