THE 37th ANNUAL IEEE TREASURE HUNT

1987 marks the 37th year of the IEEE Treasure Hunt in the Valley. The prizes awarded winners over the years have had little monetary value, yet the competition for first place has become keener each year. The excitement has grown, and the red hunting caps awarded Treasure Hunt winners have become the prized possession in many a trophy cabinet. Wearing this red crown of victory accords winners the privilege (and responsibility) of serving a three-year term on the Treasure Hunt Committee - trying to stump their cohorts.

Beginning in 1970, all two-time winners with six years of committee service, or one-time winners who have had less than three years of respite from committee service, have been offered the opportunity to declare their car "professional". This must be done upon application for tickets to the hunt.

In 1982, the 1970 resolution was amended to limit those teams who wish to declare themselves "professional" to those who have three or more members qualifying as exempt from committee service under the 1970 resolution.

Because of experience gained since 1970 in administering the 1970 "pro" resolution, the committee has made the following interpretation of the resolution: (This is being done to define in detail how the resolution should be administered and to avoid confusing situations which have occurred or might occur.)

A professional team agrees not to compete against amateur teams in the hunt. First, second, and third place prizes will be awarded to the three amateur teams with the lowest times per clue. If a professional team has the lowest time per clue for the hunt, the accomplishment will be announced, and the team members which qualify the team for "pro" status will be awarded "PRO" buttons to be affixed to their previously won red hats. In addition, this team will be admitted to the new "Pro-Button Winners" section of the Hall of Fame. Other pro teams which have times per clue lower than the third place winners will be announced for their respectable showing. Pro teams which ran near the end of the pack will also be announced in order to give encouragement to the novice first year teams which have participated. Beginning in 1985, the novice team with the best time has also been officially recognized, and encouraged to keep up the good work.

Of course, eligible hunters who chose not to be declared "professional" for the hunt will compete and be eligible for first, second, or third place. Also, if this choice is made and the team helps bring up the rear, they will be left alone to hide at their dark corner table behind their beer pitchers where they need not fear the announcement of their boondoggle.

Through the years, many couples who are not IEEE members have served on the committee. They have contributed significantly in making the Treasure Hunt the success that it has been over the past 37 years. Because of this, non-member couples who have served on the committee are given the same status as member couples when ticket preference is given. Of course, non-member ticket prices must still be paid by these couples.

The cluesite is located 120 feet south of the center of the parking lot, on the west face of a hill, next to a jojoba bush.

Proceed south on the paved road and go 0.15 miles to the cul de sac. The cluesite is located 150 feet southeast of the cul de sac, behind a cluster of palo verde trees.

This is a new concept in a working visual, a "living" working visual. The "Lady" Wizard is part of the solution. What do the first three panels show?

Panel 1: Three kings and two treys (trays) - a full house!

Panel 3: A straight (strait)!

They are all poker hands, so, see the Lady Wizard, then go ahead, do it, poke her hands. (Hint #6 in the "Hints, Wise or Otherwise" reminded you to "Reach out and touch someone, really.") 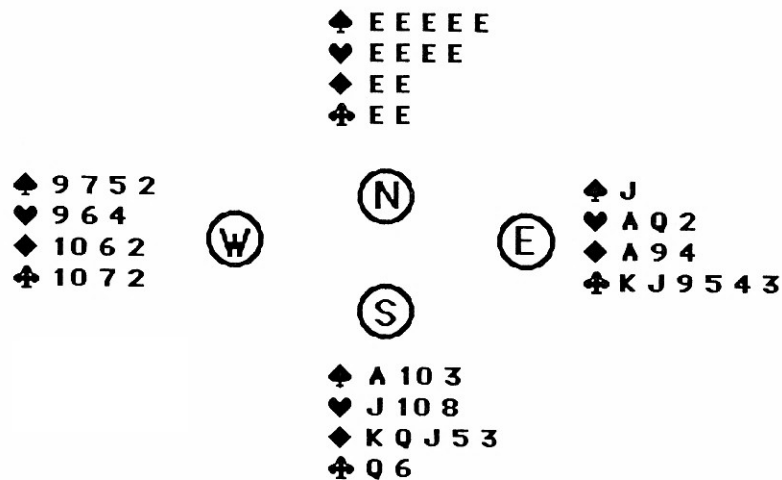

For those of you who know your differentials, this little formula is asking you for the maximum time of the treasure hunt. Obviously, this could be infinity if you didn't finish. So we put a little disclaimer in the "Hints, Wise or Otherwise". You are reminded in Hint #20 to "always avoid penalties". If you avoid penalties, the maximum time of the hunt could be from 6:15 p.m. (when we start checking out) to 11:30 p.m. (the latest you can check in without being penalized). This time is 315 minutes.....so head off to Circle 315.

Circle 315 is located near the intersection of Pima Road and Dynamite Road. From this intersection proceed east on Dynamite 0.42 miles. The cluesite is located 210 feet north of the gravel road, behind a mesquite tree.

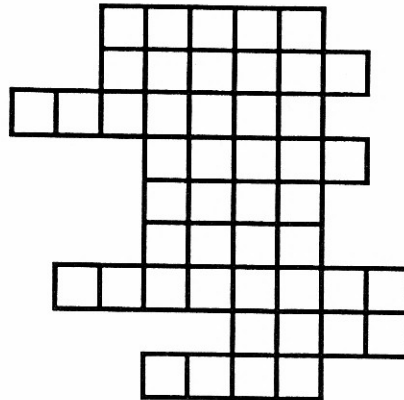

The cluesite is located 180 feet east and 75 feet south of the road, in a cluster of palo verde trees, just north of a small wash.

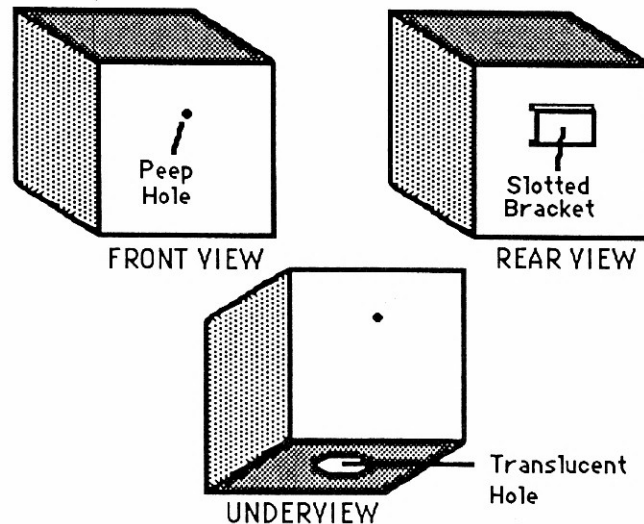

Circle 93 is located near the intersection of Scottsdale Road and Lone Mountain Road. From this intersection proceed east on Lone Mountain Road 0.5 miles to a dirt road. Turn south onto the dirt road and go 0.15 miles. The cluesite is located 225 feet west of the road, below a palo verde tree, along a small wash.

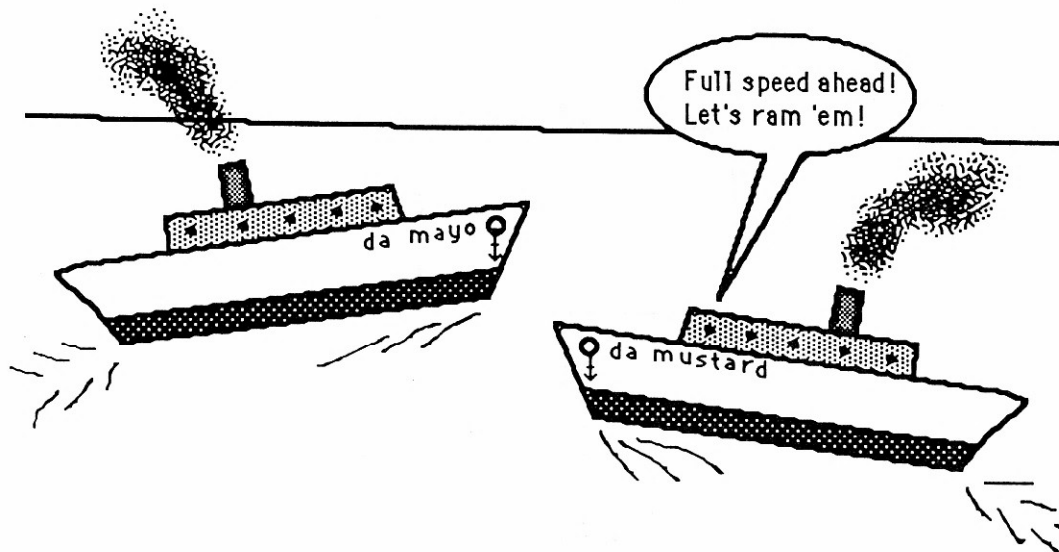

Circle 395 is located near the intersection of Cave Creek Road and Rancho Manana. From this intersection proceed west on Rancho Manana 0.35 miles to the point where a "private property" sign is posted. Proceed south (left turn from the private property) and go 0.1 miles to a 90-degree bend in the road. The cluesite is located 150 feet east of the bend and 70 feet south, at the base of a rock pile, behind a palo verde tree.

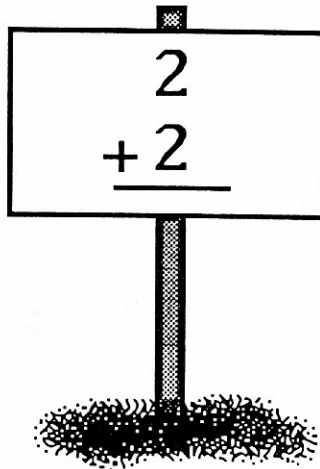

Turn east onto the dirt road and go 0.17 miles to a turn-around circle. From the circle, go south 180 feet to a wash. Proceed 75 feet southwest down the wash. The cluesite is located on the south side of the wash by a palo verde tree.
