The keen-eyed hunter will recognize the colored rings as those belonging to the official Olympics symbol. Each ring represents a continent. If you review the Olympics Facts and Stats sheet provided in the brown bag, you will notice that the number of overall medals by continent is given. The red ring represents the Americas and the green ring Oceania.

If you solve the sum of those two numbers, Americas (4250) and Oceania (717), you get **4967**.

**4967** solves the question mark. But the clue also says to **add it all up**:  $4 + 9 + 6 + 7 = 26$

The clue also shows four cities that hosted the Summer Olympics and a corresponding number of the order in which that city hosted the Summer Olympics. The HWOW provided a link to a list of all host cities to the summer Olympic Games.

The 26th official host of the Olympic Games is **Atlanta**

**If you are unable to locate Clue B, open emergency envelope 17, which will direct you to Clue C.**

*This is a Visual Clue where Hunters will find at the clue-site a pedestal with the platform shaped like a baseball "home plate." On the "Home Plate" is a solved Aristotle Puzzle. On the bottom of the puzzle will be a small trademark "Green Monster Games."*

Upon studying the board hunters will see numbers between 1 and 19 printed on each tile. And looking further, they should notice that all rows, columns, and diagonals all add up to 38. But what does 38 suggest? And why is the platform shaped like home plate?

On the HWOW there was a link to the 2001 Arizona Diamondback's World Series roster with all the players and their uniform numbers. In the brown bag there was a sample ballot for the 2021 Baseball Hall of Fame. Where is the overlap? Why, Curt Shilling, the founder of Green Monster Games, wore number 38 and is on the ballot for the 10th and final time!

All signs point to Mr. Shilling, so pitch straight for circle:

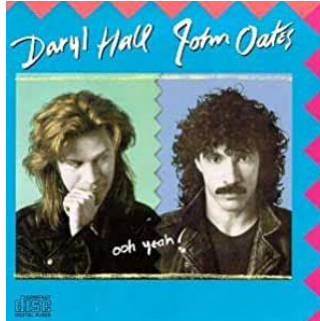
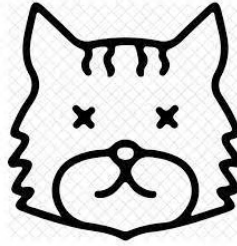

But that's not just any woman; that's the abolitionist Sojourner Truth. The yellow plane is the mascot of Spirit Airlines. What do you suppose killed the cat, if not curiosity? And the studious hunter will recognize the Mars rover as the theme of this year's hunt: Perseverance. Sojourner, Spirit, Curiosity, and Perseverance. These are four of the five rovers built by NASA Jet Propulsion Laboratory and sent to Mars. The only one missing is Opportunity. The picture of Hall & Oates is the cover of their album Ooh Yeah!, on which the track titled "Missed Opportunity" is how long? Four minutes and 47 seconds.

The Hunter finds a mathematical operation of planetary symbols, but how to calculate? By using their smarts, of course! The symbol for the planet Mars is interestingly a circle with an arrow. The Hunter finds this Mars symbol on the map which disguises itself within the other circles around it.

Using those tools, the hunters can give a kiss to the wizard in the kissing booth. The wizard will return the gesture by replacing their candy with a golden hershey's kiss. A silver kiss for a golden kiss!

But what to do with a GOLDEN KISS? Those who have done their research will know that this is a common name for the famous painting listed on the HWOW by the one and only, Gustav Klimt.

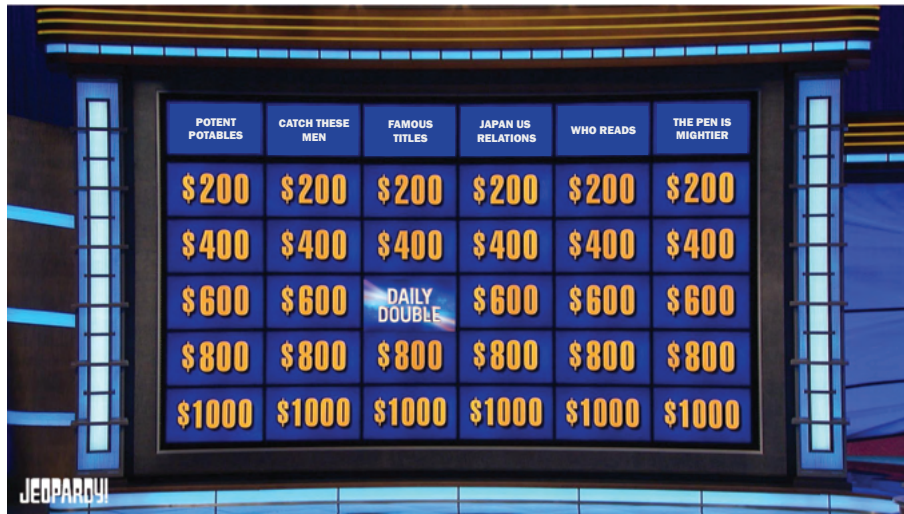

Once you get past the nostalgia and sadness thinking about beloved host Alex Trebek, put your contestant hat on. Alex has given you the answer of “the highest possible winnings of the game below.” Well, what is unique about this game of Jeopardy? The very first question is a daily double.

As a prepared hunter, you read the Jeopardy rules on the HWOW-linked Jeopardy page and know the maximum possible daily double wager is the larger of the highest remaining clue value on the board or your current score, the maximum this first question of the game can be worth is \$1,000. So the Jeopardy round maximum score is 5 categories of \$3,000, plus one category of \$2,400 plus \$1000, or \$18,400. If the daily doubles are each on \$400 squares and are chosen last in Double Jeopardy, you can go into Final Jeopardy with \$214,400, put it all on the line, and walk away with \$428,800.

Hope you didn't forget about the Daily Double being the first square chosen and end up at the \$566,400 site along with Mike Richards your Jackass friends.

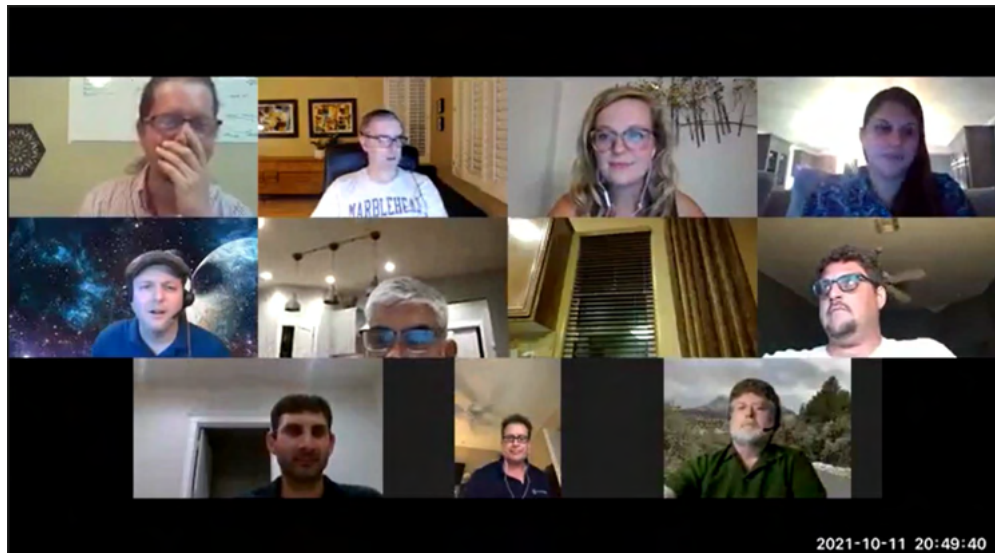

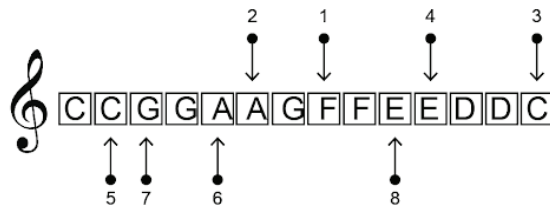

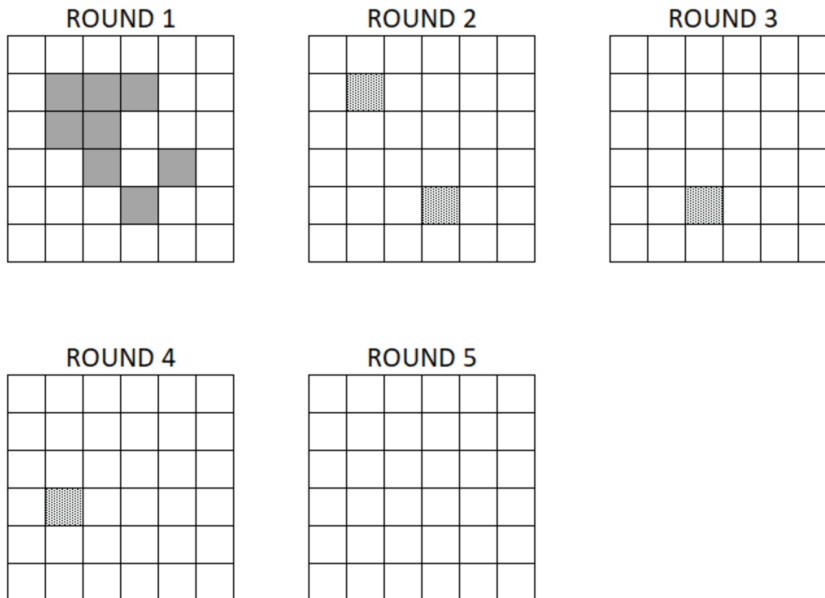

**This is emergency solution 9, which will lead you to Clue V.**

Hunters attempting to decode the Morse code in this clue will notice the letters make no sense. The word “NOT” is the clue to solving the puzzle. The HWOW link to “Complement Arithmetic” explains how to perform 1’s complement arithmetic on binary numbers. The insightful Hunter may realize that Morse code symbols are binary in nature, and swapping dots with dashes produces valid Morse code.

Decoding the ‘flipped’ Morse code produces the phrase: “Victory goes to the player who makes the next to last mistake” [Something to ponder for the 1st and 2nd place Hunt winners...]

Anyway, this sounds like a quote by somebody. The Brown Bag page “Good Quotes and Wise Quotations” provides a large number of quotes. Locating this quote (or even just the first word ‘victory’) shows the quote was by ‘Chessmaster Savielly Grigorievitch Tartakower’.

While it is not unusual for Hunters to encounter random blocks and construction materials in the desert, this seems different. Why is a block hanging from a chain? And why is it labeled "How many hours?" The crypto-astute hunter will immediately catch the reference to blockchains (the new hotness), and will recall seeing a list of top ten non-fungible tokens (which are transferred on blockchains) on the HWOW. Top on that list is an entry that involves the passage of time -- the work "Everydays - The First 5000 Days" by artist @beeples (known as Mike Winkelmann in meatspace), which sold for approximately \$69 million.

So, how many hours? It's simple:  $5000 \text{ days} * 24 \text{ hrs/day} = 120,000 \text{ hrs}$ .

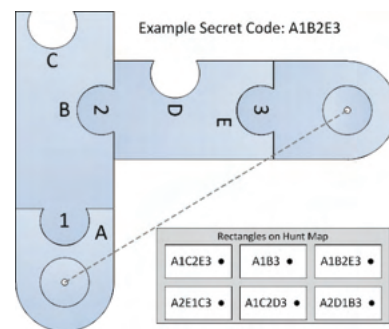

The Hunt map has rectangles containing these same codes and a black dot, but what of these puzzle pieces? Assemble the puzzle pieces in the same letter-number sequence as the codes. Place one small hole from either end of the assembled plastic pieces over the black dot within the corresponding rectangle, using the thumbtack to fix the position.

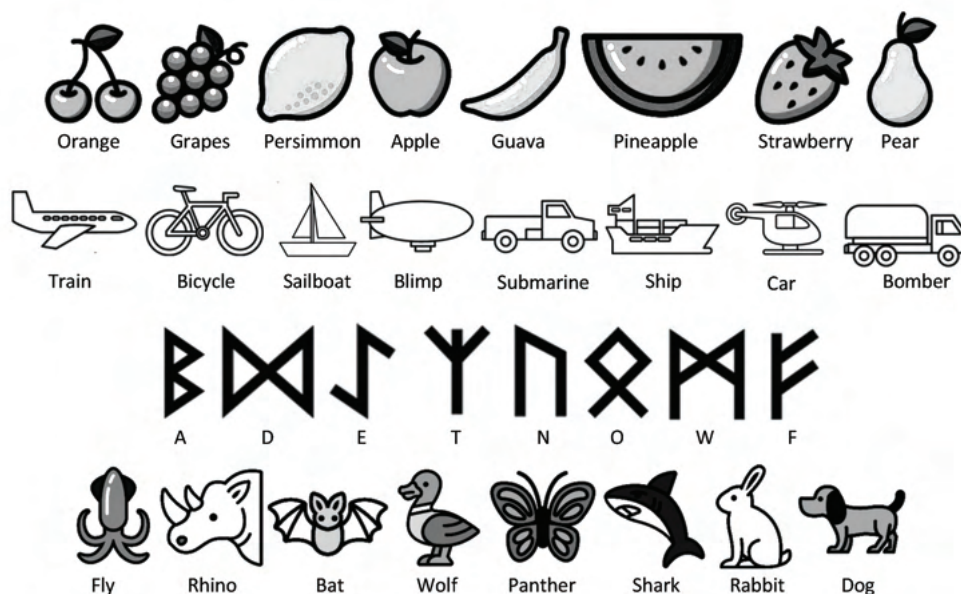
Poke the tip of a pencil or pen in the hole at the other end and draw an arc on the map, pivoting around the thumbtack. And trilateration leads us to find where the three arcs meet: at Circle "MP" for Michael Palin of Monty Python, who perhaps surprisingly, has acted with Sean Connery, Ian Holm, Robert De Nero and Jim Broadbent.

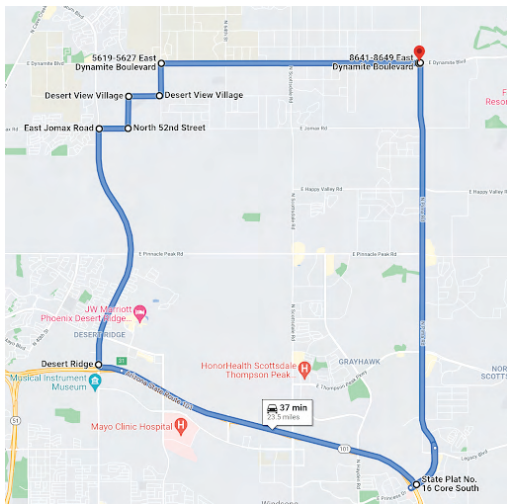

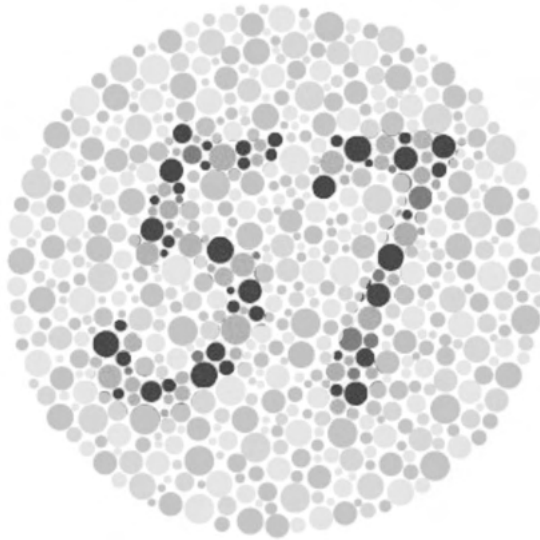

Beginning in 1970, teams with less than three years of respite from committee service and teams with six years of committee service are offered the opportunity to declare their cars Professional. This declaration must be made upon application for tickets to the Hunt. In 1981, the 1970 resolution was amended to limit those teams wishing to declare themselves Professional to those having three or more qualifying members under the 1970 resolution.

The Treasure Hunt Committee employs the following interpretations of these resolutions:

Professional teams agree not to compete against amateur teams in the Hunt. First, second, and third place prizes will be awarded to the three amateur teams with the lowest times per clue. If a professional team has the lowest time per clue for the hunt, the team will be added to the "Pro Button Winners" section of the Hall of Fame. Those team members whose status qualified the team for professional competition will be awarded Pro Buttons to be affixed to their previously awarded red hats. Any Pro teams having times per clue better than the third place winners will be identified for their commendable performances, while those Pro teams that placed closer to the other end of the pack will also receive some "special" recognition.

Teams that are eligible to declare themselves Professional for the Hunt but do not do so, for whatever reason, will compete as amateur teams and will be eligible for the first, second and third place prizes.

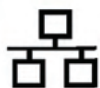

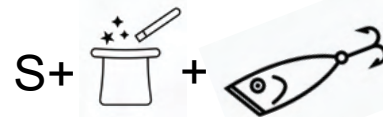
