If you are unable to solve this clue, or to find Clue $B$, open emergency envelope 11, which will direct you to Clue $B$.

## This is emergency solution 11, which will lead you to Clue B.

The astute Hunter will remember Sammy Hagar's ditty "I Can't Drive 55 " and the reminder to fill up with a full tank of gas or a full charge before the race. Leafing through all of the papers from the brown bag that have since fallen onto the floor, the perceptive hunter would notice that the ranges of 5 of the fuel efficient cars correlate with the mileage between stopping points. If one looks at the map, there are 4 stopping points prior to the finish line. Add up each of the red mileage markers on the map between stops and each point correlates to where each of the cars would run out of charge/gas if fully used. The Nissan Leaf would only go 84 miles and therefore make it to Prescott to visit Whiskey Row. The BMW i3 REx has a range of 150 miles and would make it to Williams to travel on the Grand Canyon Railway. The Tesla 60 would last 208 miles to the South Rim of the Grand Canyon while the Chevy Volt would make it further, 380 miles, to Kingman to travel down Route 66. Only the Toyota Prius would make it the full 595 miles, all of the way to the finish line in Furnace Creek, CA to visit Death Valley National Park. Follow the Prius all of the way to

The clue site is in the wash behind a Palo Verde tree.

## This is Clue B. Solving this clue will lead you to Clue C.

This clue consists of a long pipe propped up on two wooden stands in the middle of the desert.

The pipe has an opening on one end while the other is sealed with a clear window for viewing.

Multiple holes are present along the underside of the pipe.


If you are unable to solve this clue, or to find Clue $C$, open emergency envelope 21, which will direct you to Clue $\mathbf{C}$.

## This is emergency solution 21, which will lead you to Clue C.

This clue is a working visual consisting of a long sloped pipe leading into a container with a viewing hole. Since the high end is open and inviting, the inquisitive Hunter will naturally want to investigate what happens when water is poured into it. Good thing the HWOW recommended that Hunters bring four gallons with them. But hold on, the water is leaking out of the bottom of the pipe! Looks like the entire Hunt team will need to assist by plugging these holes with their hands so that the container can fill up. This includes one hole beneath the container itself.

Once enough water fills the container, multiple ping pong balls float into the viewing area with music symbols on them. Music loving Hunters will immediately realize that they are "streaming" music and remember that the brown bag had an article about Taylor Swift streaming her album on Apple Music. So plug in those earbuds, Shake It Off and travel in Style over to on $19^{\text {th }}$ Avenue for 2.3 miles to Lone Cactus Dr. Turn right on Lone Cactus and proceed West for 0.2 miles to 2031 W. Lone Cactus Drive and park. The clue site is at the front entrance of the ACRI Building.

What's all this drama with the Dalai Lama? Hunters should recall watching the Mule Tube clip of "Llama Drama As Animal Run Wild On Streets". Two Sun City llamas broke free and ran the streets, only to be eventually lassoed back into custody. When Hunters come to a very drama filled Dalai Lama who asks, "How will it end?" the answer is easier than wrangling llamas! Head on over to drama.

If you are unable to solve this clue, or to find Clue E, open emergency envelope 20, which will direct you to Clue $E$.

This is emergency solution 20, which will lead you to Clue E.
A clever hunter would realize that this Book of Idioms is not a book at all but rather a combination lock safe. And the really clever Hunter would remember the list of idioms from the HWOW:

> Behind the eight ball
> A bird in the hand is worth two in the bush
> Back to square one
> If at first you don't succeed, try and try again

A combination lock and idioms that mention numbers eight, two, and one. Trying each of the 6 combinations of this number trio gets you the solution. ( 281 for one safe, 812 for the second safe and 128 for the third safe). Once opened you see a grave with a headstone that reads R. I. P., representing the Idiom "Six feet under" of course! Head on over to
 to dig up your next clue.
is located in Map Grid C11. From the intersection of Deer Valley Road and $7^{\text {th }}$ Street, proceed North on $7^{\text {th }}$ Street for 1.8 miles. Continue onto Happy Valley Road for 2.1 miles ( $7^{\text {th }}$ Street turns into Happy Valley Road). Turn right on $19^{\text {th }}$ Avenue and proceed North for 0.7 miles to Briles. Turn right on Briles and park 270 ft East of $19^{\text {th }}$ Avenue on dirt road. Clue is 180 ft North of Briles, behind a large tree.

Big corporations seem to have a theme in their naming conventions - Apple Macbook AIR, Amazon Kindle FIRE, and Google's EARTH. What do these three things have in common - well that is elementary my dear Watson - Earth, Air and Fire are 3 of the 4 elements in the classic model of nature. So it appears that we are missing the element water. Who else is missing the element water? Well the state of California has been in a massive drought for the last several years and bottled water companies are a major source of controversy. According to the article on the HWOW the major corporation at the center of the controversy is Nestle, so head on over to Corporate logo.

is located in Map Grid A6. From the intersection of Jomax Road and $19^{\text {th }}$ Avenue, proceed West on Jomax Road for 1.8 miles to I-17 (Black Canyon Highway). Turn right on I-17 and proceed North for 3.6 miles to Dove Valley Road (exit 222). Exit I-17 onto Dove Valley Road and make a right onto Dove Valley Road. Continue East on Dove Valley for 0.25 miles to $32^{\text {nd }}$ Avenue. Turn left on $32^{\text {nd }}$ Avenue and proceed 190 ft . Park North of the substation, clue is in plain sight.


This visual clue consists of a pair of binoculars (stored in a container on a post) and a notice displaying 'Tips for Beginners'.

In the distance there is a lighted area. When you look at the lighted area through the binoculars, you see a gold apple.

If you are unable to solve this clue, or to find Clue G, open emergency envelope 3, which will direct you to Clue $G$.

## This is emergency solution 3 , which will lead you to Clue G.

Binoculars and helpful 'Tips for Beginners' - it looks like we are supposed to watch something, but what could that be?
Observant Hunters will have spotted the lighted object out in the desert - and using the binoculars would have identified it as an apple.
Forget the wildlife, you are on an Apple Watch! But wait, this isn't just any apple. Following the 'Tips for Beginners' you should also take care to identify the color as gold. It is a Gold Apple Watch that you are on.
Luckily the Brown Bag has a list of various Apple Watch prices with the Gold Apple Watch costing a whopping 10,000 dollars.
Bust out your wallet and head over to for your next clue.

If you are unable to solve this clue, or to find Clue $H$, open emergency envelope 25, which will direct you to Clue $H$.

This is emergency solution 25, which will lead you to Clue $H$.

Only a weak-minded fool would need the force to solve this clue. Instead a simple knowledge of the Star Wars universe is needed. The first picture is a space ship, but not the common X-wing popular with Nerf herders, but the Y-wing version instead. Then there is a poster from Return of the Jedi, which was the third movie released to theaters back in 1983, but it is the 6th movie in the timeline. The next part is the famous quote between our hero and his instructor, but missing a single word (afraid). This clue is a word search filled with the names of astronomical objects. Upon finding and circling all of the words an observant Hunter will see the name Spock spelled out. That's right, this has been The Search For Spock! Sadly Leonard Nimoy passed away this year and the HWOW had a link to an article about how Leonard Nimoy's legacy is being kept alive by naming an asteroid after him: 4864 Nimoy. Surely this is the answer, but wait, there is no Circle 4864 on the big map! There is only one other map to consult and that is the Genesis Mountain Fire District map in the Brown Bag and wasn't Genesis the planet where Spock was found? Sure enough, there is a station 4864 just a couple of miles up the road. But hold on. That is OFF THE MAP! That's right you must boldly go where no van has gone before! So engage your warp drive and fly over to Station 4864 to get your next clue.

This clue is a visual of a stick figure made out of envelopes all addressed to different people named David. The late night hour should give you a clue that this isn't just a man made out of envelopes, but in fact a letter man. A David Letter Man in fact! David Letterman retired this year and the truly observant Hunter will notice that the TV guide listing from the brown bag is airing the Late Show With David Letterman on Channel 005 . Hunters who love astronomy will have undoubtedly noticed the 19 stars scattered around the map. These stars represent the main stars of the constellation Orion.
The HWOW contained the story of Orion's never ending pursuit of the Pleiades. The map's Orion is engaged in the same chase and drawing him will allow you to locate the Seven Sisters.
But doing so leads you to a map circle for the car company Subaru? Turns out, this is the Japanese name for the Pleiades star cluster (as detailed in the Brown Bag article on constellation names and on the Subaru nameplate). So head on over to the prize that Orion never will.

This is Clue N. Solving this clue will lead you to Clue 0.

What appears to be a large box with the words "Jackass, Burro, Donkey and Horse" written in large letters at the bottom of the box.


If you are unable to solve this clue, or to find Clue $\mathbf{O}$, open emergency envelope 7, which will direct you to Clue $\mathbf{O}$.

This is emergency solution 7 , which will lead you to Clue $\mathbf{O}$.

A deep box with words at the bottom including the dreaded Jackass - this can't be good. Poetic hunters will link the box to the HWOW haiku "Oh big box big box, can office supplies outfox? No? String surely rocks." Office supplies, string, what does this even mean? Well, the resourceful hunter will grab the "office supplies" packet of paper clips and string purchased at checkout and use the string to lower the paper clips into the box. This clue is a piece of paper stating "THIS IS AN EMERGENCY". Taking the wise hint from HWOW "It is good to have extras (just in case of an emergency)", Hunters should have searched through their stack of Emergency envelopes for the one with EXTRA written on the front. If you had ripped that envelope open instead of this one, you would have received this solution without any penalty minutes by following the directions: Take the circle you are at "PH" and add "one" to get Phone. But since you are reading this, sadly you must add 20 minutes to your time and head on over to to get your next clue.
 is located in Map Grid K11. From the intersection of Lone Mountain and Cave Creek Road, proceed East on Lone Mountain for 1.2 miles to 56th Street. Turn right on 56th Street and proceed South for 3.1 miles until the road veers off at Jomax Road and park. The clue site is 270 ft South of Jomax $/ 56^{\text {th }}$ intersection on the South side of a Palo Verde tree (North of a saguaro cactus).

Beginning in 1970, all committee members with less than three years of respite from committee service and all committee members with six years of committee service are offered the opportunity to declare their cars Professional. This declaration must be made upon application for tickets to the Hunt. In 1981, the 1970 resolution was amended to limit those teams wishing to declare themselves Professional to those having three or more qualifying members under the 1970 resolution.

The Treasure Hunt Committee employs the following interpretations of these resolutions.
Professional teams agree not to compete against amateur teams in the Hunt. First, second, and third place prizes will be awarded to the three amateur teams with the lowest times per clue. If a professional team has the lowest time per clue for the hunt, the team will be added to the "Pro Button Winners`section of the Hall of Fame. Those team members whose status qualified the team for professional competition will be awarded Pro Buttons to be affixed to their previously awarded red hats. All Pro teams having times per clue better than the third place winners will be identified for their commendable performances, while those Pro teams that placed closer to the other end of the pack will also receive some`special` recognition.

Teams that are eligible to declare themselves Professional for the Hunt yet do not do so, for whatever reason, will compete as amateur teams and be eligible for the first, second and third place prizes.
